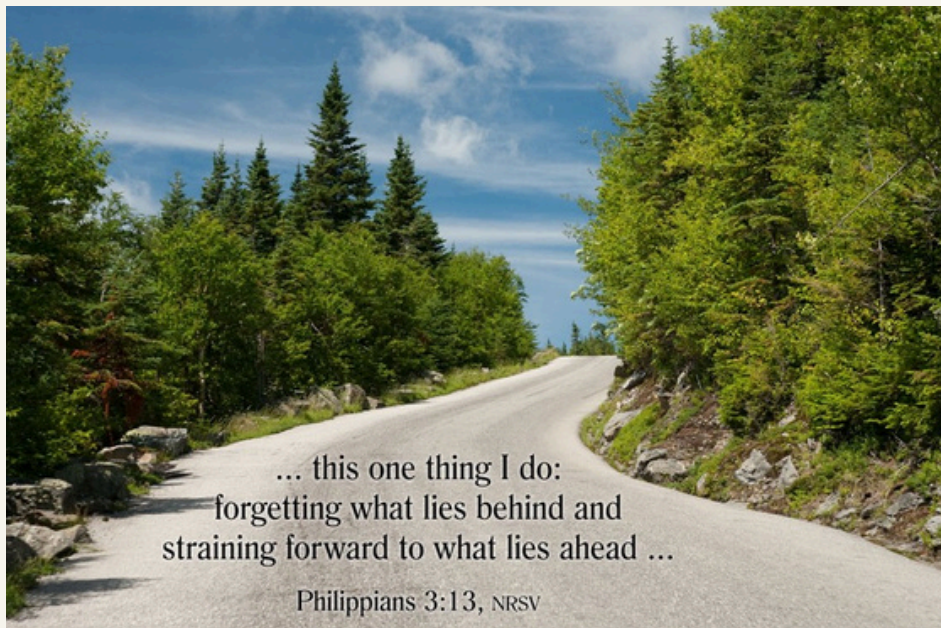

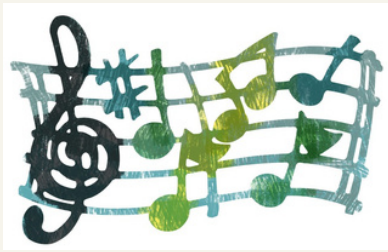

Stars to Light the Way

Even when the nights are dark and long, says Annette Erbes, stars shine brightly to light the way, bringing us joy and leading us to God.

Three phone calls. Not from children with holiday updates. Or friends sharing Christmas greetings. Three phone calls from Bronson Methodist Hospital on Christmas Eve night to share that my brother had been admitted to the ICU and was being placed on a ventilator.

The holiday season suddenly became a series of trips back and forth to Kalamazoo, not the one we had anticipated, expected, or wanted. My trips became daily journeys while my brother remained in the ICU over the next three weeks. My husband and I would usually travel in the early morning darkness to avoid the Grand Rapids rush hour, and some days we would travel home after it was already dark. I remember a close call, not with the expected deer but with a coyote, its sharp, bright eyes staring directly into our headlights on I-96 just a few miles from home. It's amazing what you can unexpectedly encounter in the darkness.

After three long weeks of overwhelming health struggles in the ICU, my brother passed away. My daily journeys to Kalamazoo became weekly, and over the next five months, I continued to plan a memorial service with my sister, care for his house and estate, and handle his finances. Again came the unexpected phone calls: a dead deer in his backyard on the day of the first house showing, a broken water main down the street from his house, and more...

This seems like an apt description of my journeys to and from Kalamazoo during dark mornings and early sunsets, dealing with the immediate needs of "now." However, there were stars to light the way.

The compassion, kindness, and expertise demonstrated by the medical staff in the ICU shone brightly. Three months before his passing, my brother had begun putting his affairs in order, which brought forth the next star to light my way, his estate lawyer, who was knowledgeable, caring, and gracious. She then directed us to follow the stars to other caring professionals, such as the realtor, estate coordinators, CPA, and financial advisor. All of them were simply doing their jobs, but they truly provided a ministry of care and support.

Other signs of light included my sister and brother-in-law, who traveled from afar to join in the sorting, organizing, and planning amid laughter, joy, tears, and surprise at both the expected and unexpected. My church family, who offered prayers and ongoing support. My dear pastor friend, who led the memorial service with care and compassion. Family and friends who braved serious winter weather to attend the memorial service and share memories, laughter, and support.

A long-ago family friend, Harold E. Kohn, keenly described this Advent paradox in his poem and book, both titled Seeing Stars:

Only in the darkness do we see the stars; and when the night is darkest, stars shine most brightly.

*It was the darkness of their times that made it possible for wise men to follow the star
to the manger of Bethlehem where they found Christ.*

Wise men of every age learn how to use darkness to find the Light, and the gloomiest times to find God...

...Isaiah 35 reminds us where to find our hope and joy: "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. . . . A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way" (vv. 4, 8).

Wherever we find ourselves in a moment of darkness ... I pray we will make time to find and see the stars. They are present — shining in unexpected ways and places, through unexpected people, and guiding us as John the Baptist pointed to the One to come. May we wait with shimmering glimmers of hope for what we know — and trust — is coming.

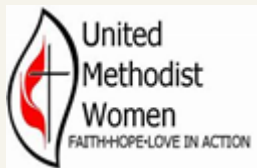

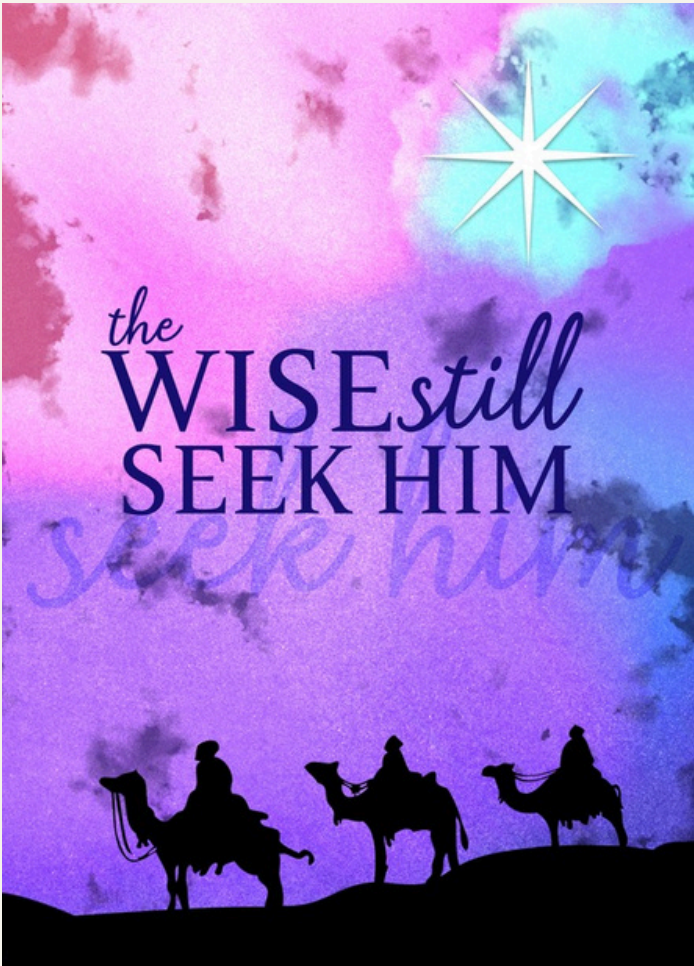

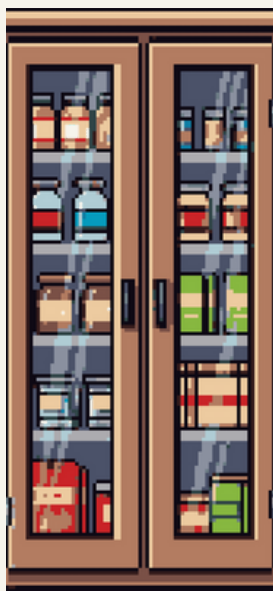

LOVE IS Action!
